☐ I have a thesis that is a clear, complex sentence in my introduction.
Complex Sentence = Independent Clause + Dependent Clause(s)
I have strong topic sentences that support the thesis.
I have a conclusion that restates my thesis in new terms.
Body Paragraphs
☐ I have a clear topic sentence.
☐ I have two to three sets of CERs supporting the topic sentence.
CER = Claim + Evidence + Rationale
I have transitions that show the relationship between ideas.
I have a conclusion that relates back to my thesis statement.
Sentences
I have used a variety of sentences (simple, complex, compound).
I have used precise words (do not use vague words, such as "a lot", "kind of", "things").
I have used correct punctuation and grammar.
I have cited sources correctly.
